# 2021 LOCAL SHARE FUNDS ANNUAL REPORT



## ABOUT THE PA RACE HORSE DEVELOPMENT AND GAMING ACT

The PA Race Horse Development and Gaming Act (Act 71 of 2004) established a system for ensuring that local governments received a share of the revenues generated by gaming. The “Local Share” system was designed to distribute varying portions of terminal slot machine revenues of licensed gaming facilities to mitigate the impact of gaming and related activities and support and enhance community and economic well-being. The funds are distributed primarily to the licensed facility’s host municipality and county.

All counties and municipalities receiving distributions of local share assessments are required by Act 1 of 2010 to submit information to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED). DCED is required to submit an annual report to the legislative Appropriations, Community, Economic and Recreational Development, and Gaming Oversight Committees on all distributions of local share assessments (gaming funds) to counties and municipalities. (Note that Act 42 of 2017, P.L. 419 title 4 amendment changed the date for submission by DCED, of the annual report to the Legislature, from August 31st to March 31st every year). DCED’s report to the legislature must include:

- Amount and use of funds received by the municipalities and counties in the prior calendar year
- A description of how the funds were used – either deposited in a general fund or committed to a specific use or project.

This twelfth annual report submission details receipts and expenditures in calendar year 2021 of the “local share funds” (slot machines and table games) by respective recipient counties and municipalities (local governments) that reported their respective information to DCED.

A total of 133 local governments (counties and municipalities) submitted local share funds reports to DCED in time for this report. Approximately 192 local governments received distributions of funds from the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue and DCED or redistributions from other contiguous counties. The 133 reports submitted to DCED represent 69.27% response rate for this reporting year. DCED will continue efforts to improve the response rate by local governments in filing their annual reports.

The 133 local governments reported **\$117,571,407.06** in total revenues from slot machines, table games and interest receipts, and **\$115,801,229.08** in total expenditures, as detailed below. Note that some local governments spent more funds than what they received in 2021. The additional expenditures are from revenues carried forward from previous calendar years – 2008 to 2020.

Below are the revenue and expenditure details of the 133 local governments that filed reports with DCED for 2021 calendar year:
