CDBG funds enable communities to effectively address many of their needs, such as infrastructure, housing, and community facilities.

WHO'S ELIGIBLE?

CDBG consists of two components for eligible applicants:

- Annual funding to designated municipalities through the formula-based state entitlement program, which includes counties, cities, boroughs, and townships in rural and nonmetropolitan areas of Pennsylvania.
- Competitive project funding available to eligible local governments set aside for critical infrastructure or revitalization projects.

USES

CDBG funds can be used for:

- · Housing rehabilitation
- · Public services
- · Community facilities
- Infrastructure improvement (water, sewer, storm water)
- · Streets and sidewalks
- Economic development
- Planning
